
September 16, 2023 WORKSHOP BY TLC

On 20th September 2023, a career guidance session was conducted at auditorium for XI and XII students. The objective of this session was to provide students

with valuable insights into career choices and help them understand how their personality traits relate to potential career paths. The session was led by an experienced facilitator and proved to be informative and interactive.

The session began with a dynamic icebreaker activity, where students were encouraged to brainstorm and name various careers. This activity served as an engaging warm -up, setting a positive tone for the rest of the session.

Following the icebreaker, the facilitator provided a comprehensive introduction to the session's purpose and objectives. The primary focus was to help students make informed decisions about their future careers.



The facilitator then introduced the concept of different personality traits and how they influence career choices. These traits were categorized

into four pairs: introvert (I) or extrovert (E), intuitive (N) or sensor (S), feeler (F) or thinker (T), and judger (J) or perceiver (P). Students were asked to reflect on their own personalities and choose one preference from each pair, recording the respective letters as a code in their notes.

These codes were then correlated with suitable career choices, providing students with a valuable framework for exploring potential career paths that align with their personality traits.

Afterward, students were prompted to select and list three career fields that piqued their interest, in order of preference. This exercise encouraged students to consider their passions and inclinations when contemplating their future careers.

The session took a deeper dive into personal aspirations when students were asked to describe their ideal work environments and conditions. This exercise encouraged self-reflection and helped students articulate the kind of professional setting that would best suit their preferences and personality.

In conclusion, the facilitator emphasized the significance of the information shared during the session. Students were informed that this knowledge could serve as a helpful guide when making future career decisions, ensuring that they choose paths that align with their unique strengths and inclinations.



Overall, the session was met with enthusiasm and active participation from the students. The interactive nature of the activities made the learning experience enjoyable and memorable. Students left the session with a sense of empowerment, knowing that they have the tools to make informed career choices.

The second and final stop on the tour was the Vainu Bappu Observatory, an astronomical facility owned and operated by the Indian Institute of Astrophysics. Located in the picturesque Javadi Hills, this observatory houses various telescopes and instruments used for astronomical research.

During the visit, students had the opportunity to explore one of the observatory's prized possessions, a 96-inch telescope. The observatory staff provided an informative explanation of the telescope's workings and conducted a demonstration. This experience greatly expanded the students' understanding of celestial phenomena and scientific research.

After these enriching experiences, students had the chance to capture memories of the day with photographs. A brief tea break followed, and at 6:15 p.m., the group began its journey back to Chennai, safe and sound.
