## Visit to AAVIN: Exploring the World of Milk Processing - August 1, 2024

On August 1, 2024, students from classes 7 and 8 had an exciting opportunity to visit AAVIN in Sholinganallur, Chennai, as part of the Recognition of International Dimension in Schools (RIDS) program. The visit provided a closer look at the food processing industry, with a special focus on dairy production.

During the visit, students learned about the fascinating journey of milk, from its collection to final packaging. They observed how milk is maintained at the right temperature throughout the process and explored various AAVIN milk products, including AAVIN Nice, AAVIN Delite, AAVIN Premium, and AAVIN Diet, each distinguished by different colors like blue, green, and orange.

The tour included a visit to the packaging unit, where students saw the steps involved in preparing milk for distribution and the storage facilities that keep it fresh. They also gained insights into the concept of Solid Non-Fat (SNF) and a deeper understanding of the nutritional components of milk.

As a special treat, students enjoyed AAVIN ice cream, chocolate, and biscuits during the visit, with a nominal entry fee of ₹50 collected from each participant.

Discussions on milk shelf life and storage practices further enriched their knowledge of dairy product sustainability.

This activity provided valuable insights into how food preservation practices vary around the world and enhanced our skills in data analysis and presentation.
