



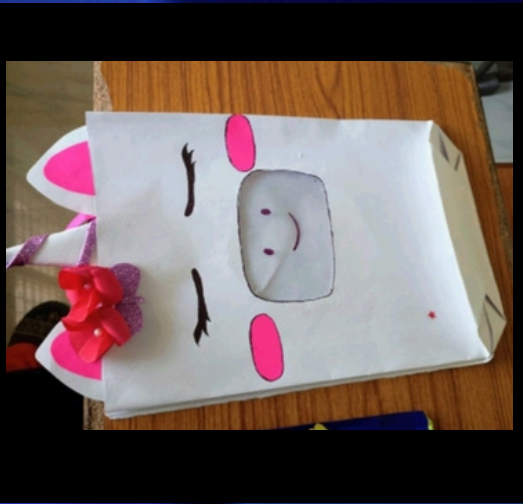

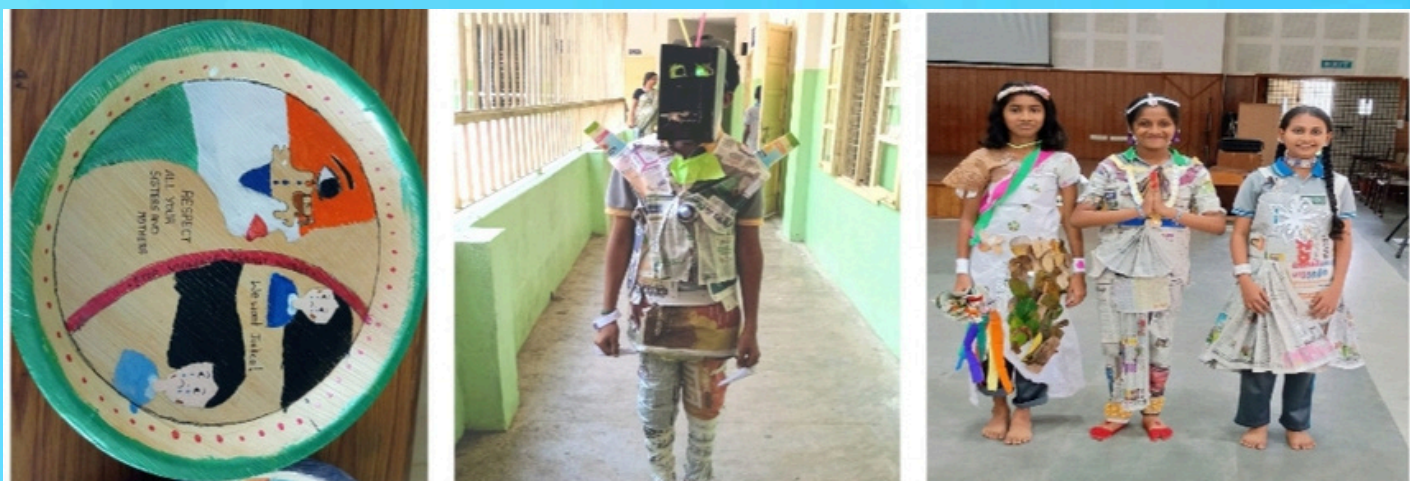


The activities for each grade were as follows:

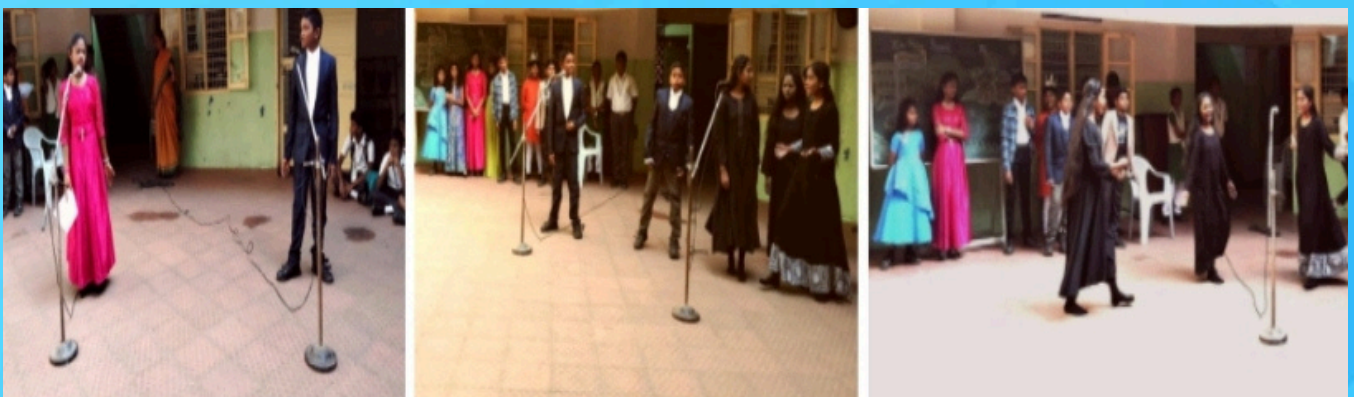
## **ENGLISH DRAMATICS CLUB - STANDARD 7**

- **Improvisation and Drama Games:** These activities encouraged quick thinking, creativity, and teamwork.

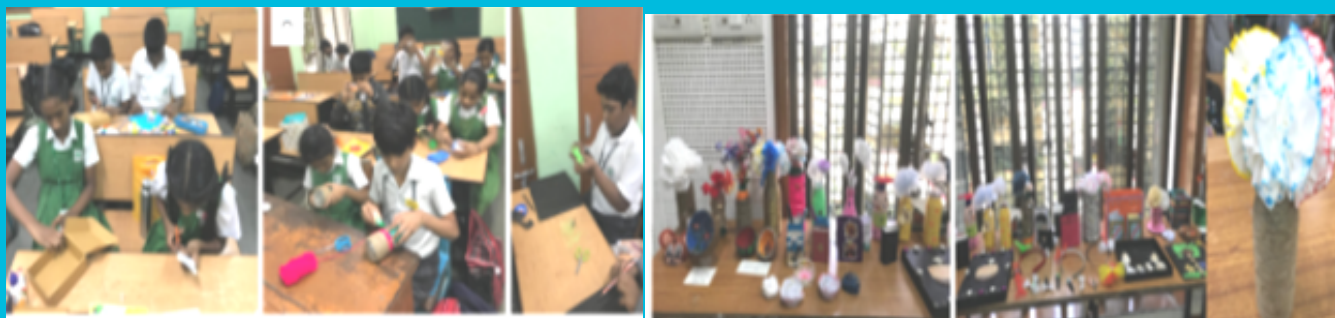
- **Character Building and Technical Work:** Workshops on character development and stagecraft allowed students to gain a well-rounded theatre experience.

As one saying goes, “Crafting is the best way to show someone how much you care,” and through these projects, our students have truly embraced the joy of creativity.

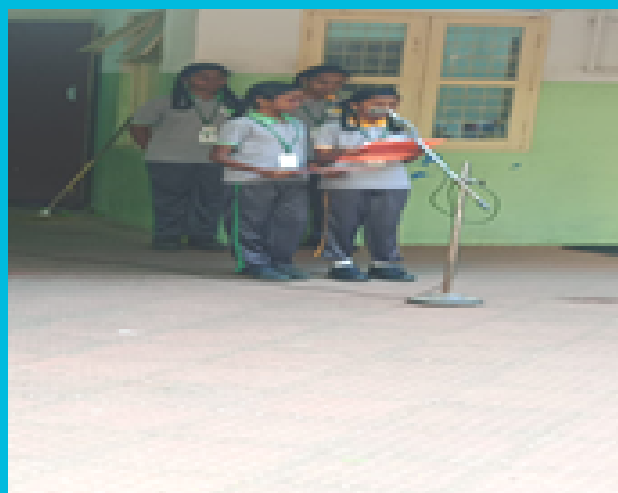


## CHESS AND CARROM CLUB REPORT (2024-25) – CLASS 7
