We are proud to announce the remarkable achievement of S.K. Litesh Abinav of our school, who has earned national-level recognition for his outstanding performance in a prestigious fitness and martial arts-based world record attempt.

Litesh participated in the Official World Record Attempt organised by the Indian Art & Culture Federation in association with the Oscar's Book of Records, held on 9th November 2025 at Montessori School, Guindy, Chennai. Demonstrating exceptional determination, agility, and physical discipline, he successfully completed the challenge as part of a large national cohort.

His performance has been officially acknowledged, and he has received the Certificate of Participation in the World Record Attempt. In addition, he has been recognised by Oscar's Book of Records for participating in the category "Most Participants Performing Front Kicks in 60 Seconds Simultaneously." This feat required focus, endurance, and meticulous execution, all of which he carried out with impressive consistency.

This achievement reflects not only Litesh's physical skill but also his dedication to continuous improvement. He has made the school proud by representing it with such excellence on a national platform.

# November 13, 2025

## CAREER GUIDANCE PROGRAMME – ARCHITECTURE



On 13th November, our school organised an enriching Career Guidance Programme led by **Professor Mrs. Anuradha Menon** from the **MEASI Academy of Architecture**. The session aimed to acquaint students with the dynamic field of Architecture and the diverse opportunities it offers.



Professor Anuradha Menon began by explaining the distinction between STEM and STEAM. She clarified that STEM comprises Science, Technology, Engineering and Mathematics, while STEAM incorporates Arts, making the learning approach more creative and design-oriented. She highlighted that Architecture beautifully blends technical knowledge with imaginative thinking, standing as a perfect example of how science and creativity converge.

To deepen students' understanding, she presented photographs from their college, showcasing a variety of student projects that reflected innovation and architectural skill. She also displayed images of iconic buildings familiar to all, helping students connect architectural principles with real-world structures. These visuals made the world of architecture vivid and engaging, sparking curiosity and inspiring students to think beyond routine classroom learning.

Professor Menon further explained the pathway to becoming an architect. She discussed eligibility requirements, entrance examinations, the value of creativity and observational skills, and the structure of the five-year B.Arch programme. She also highlighted the vast scope of architecture, including avenues such as building design, interior design, urban planning, landscape architecture, heritage conservation, and construction management.



The session was highly interactive, with students actively responding to questions and expressing their interest in exploring architecture as a career. Professor Menon's clear explanations and relatable examples made complex ideas easy to grasp.

We express our sincere gratitude to our **Principal In-charge**, **Vice Principal In-charge**, **Section Head**, and all the teachers for organising such an enlightening and inspiring programme.

Overall, the Career Guidance Programme proved to be deeply informative and motivating, offering students a clear insight into the field of architecture and its exciting future possibilities.
