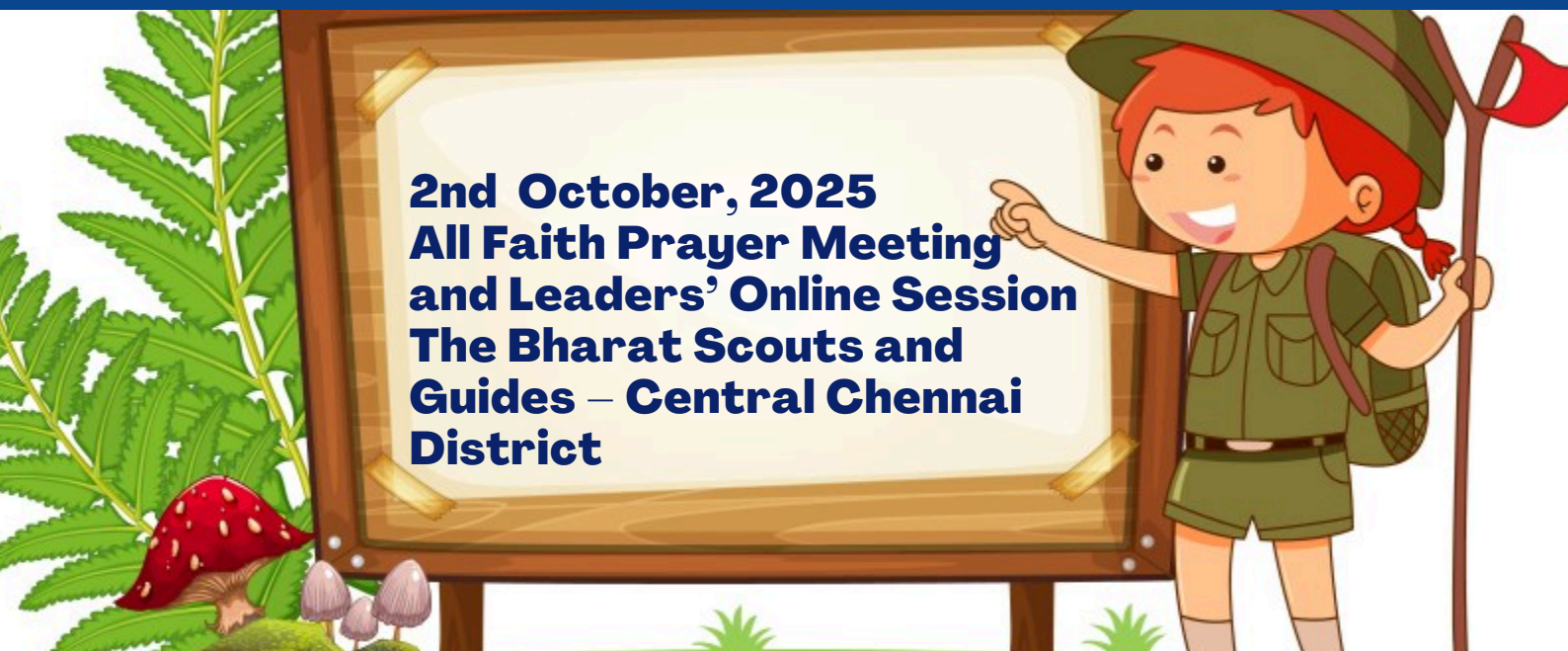

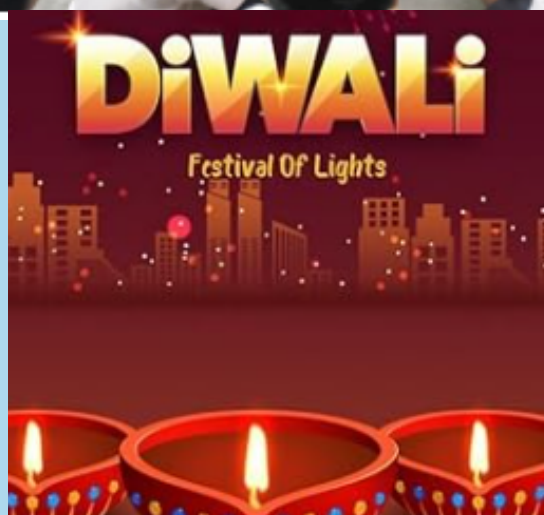


16 October. 2025 Diwali Celebration – Nursery Department

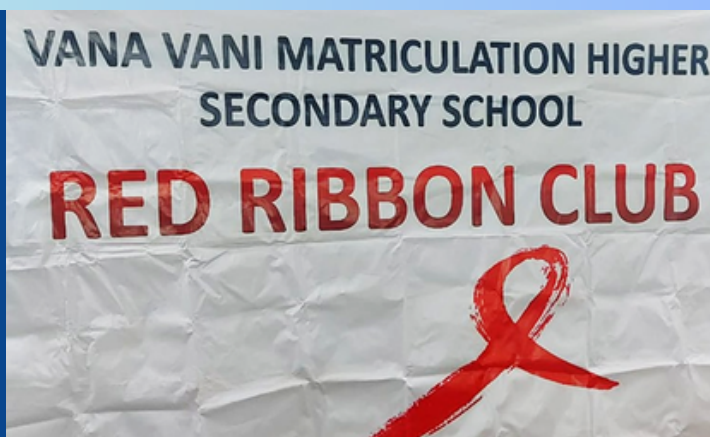
