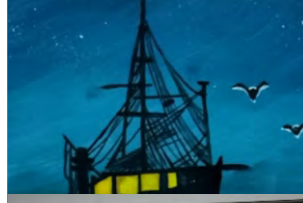

The pass percentage in Class X was 97.45%. The highest total of 492/500 was secured by ADELINE MARY N and ABINAYA S, followed by KANISHGA B with 485/500 and HARINI SREE S with 482/500. We had two centums in Social Science.

The pass percentage in Class XII was 99.44%. The topper in the science stream was JANANI K with 585 / 600 and A B DHARANEE with 590 / 600 was the topper in Commerce stream. We had three centums in French, two centums in Computer Science and Accountancy and one centum each in Biology, Economics, & Commerce.

The pass percentage in Class XI board exam was 100% with two centums in Physics. MOUMITA ANBUHELWAN was the topper in Science stream with a total of 578/600 and LOKA PRIYA M with 533/600 was the topper in the Commerce stream.

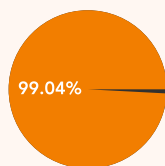
