Class 4 - Students redesigned their favourite story's book cover.

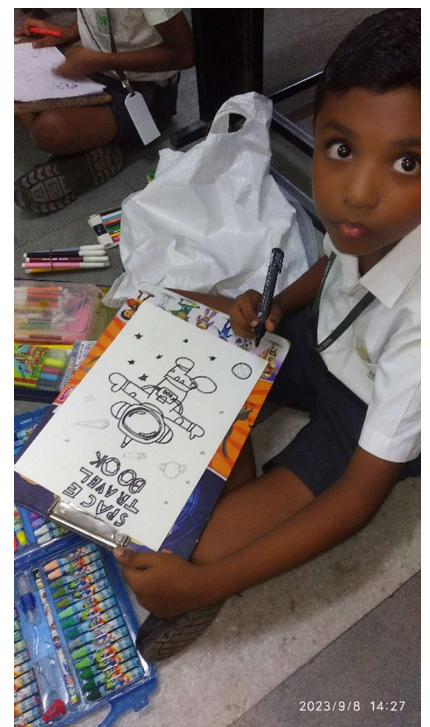
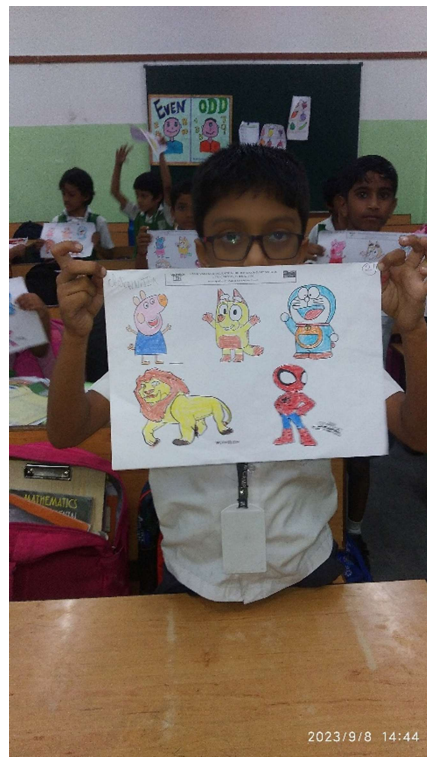
